Days 2-6, 11/13 to 11-17: The Comprehensive Acoustic Course will train participants in recording and analyzing bat calls through hands-on experience in the classroom and in the field. The emphasis will be on developing the skills required to identify bats acoustically, stressing effective interpretation of software displays and getting the most from the different technologies.
